D Rosen is an artist and writer whose practice is rooted in interspecies care, queer ecologies, and critical animal studies. With over a decade of professional experience as an animal caregiver across farms, sanctuaries, and shelters, Rosen's work uses casting, enrichment design, and site-relational practice to make ethological knowledge accessible and poetically resonant. Publications include peer-reviewed contributions to Routledge, Antennae, and Sixty Inches From Center. Rosen holds an MFA from the University of Chicago and a BFA from Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design. They have completed residencies at Skowhegan, S12, USF Verftet, JOYA, and HEIMA. Rosen continues to work at the intersections of animal care, artistic practice, and writing, both in the US and abroad.
