

Flock blocks carved by Mice's teeth, Cow hair woven into handmade incense, Chicken swings painted in colors calibrated for Chicken color vision: my sculptures carry the physical impressions of non-human animals I've cared for on farms, in sanctuaries, and in shelters. For over a decade, I have spent weeks, months, and years feeding, grooming, medicating, and providing enrichment for Cows, Horses, Chickens, Ducks, Goats, Sheep, Dogs, and Cats. These more-than-human traces are often cast in low-temperature metals, such as pewter sourced from online gun and fishing supply markets, and repurposed into objects that hold interspecies impressions.

Carework is also where my thinking about queerness and transness takes root. I draw from biological studies of queer and trans animals, from the allofeeding bonds of vampire Bats to the fashioned expressions of trans sunangel Hummingbirds. As a trans person, this research offers a different account of nature, one where queerness and transness are written into the biological record rather than positioned against it. But more than theory, this research reflects something I've found in the carework itself: non-human animals have been friends and teachers in places where humans were less welcoming. Multispecies ties are not incidental to my practice. They are its foundation.

Humans are animals enmeshed in the same systems of domestication, care, and structural harm we impose on other species. My work pushes against the anthropocentric knowledge systems that insist otherwise. Through sculpture, I aim to make interspecies entanglements visible and felt, in the hope of inciting multispecies coalition-building and interspecies care.
